The Impact

Seeking Invstment Opportunities

A portion of the BCF investment portfolio utilizes 7% of \$35,000,000 which is loaned and repaid providing positive impact on our communities through low-cost loans that bolster the economy. The interest payments are allocated through the earnings our overall investment portfolio enjoys. While that is all beneficial, impact investments return far more than financial returns. Growing businesses by infusing capital into our community vs investing in the stock market has a tangible local impact. Much like shopping, giving and living local, we invest locally. Currently 13 businesses have affordable loans helping them expand and compete, which provides local products, services, and jobs to our community. This approach promotes inclusion and equity for all residents, businesses, and organizations through equitable access to capital.

The Focus The Process provides Results

Every investment needs to help to create a compassionate social, economic, and political environment where people have full opportunities to meet basic needs for themselves and their families (specifically housing,) to build assets, and to advance themselves. The committee analyses the impact on one or many of the 7 areas the community foundation prioritizes for building a healthy community: Education, Economy, Basic Needs, Environment, Neighborhoods, Arts & Culture, and Health & Wellness
